











REQUIRED MARINE SAFETY EQUIPMENT

	Protected waters lakes, rivers, inlets and estuaries	0 - 2 Nautical miles from the mainland shore	2 - 5 Nautical miles from the mainland shore	Over 5 Nautical miles from the mainland shore
 <p>BILGE PUMP / BAILER All vessels must carry a bilge pump. A vessel under 7 metres may carry a bailer in lieu of a bilge pump.</p>	✓	✓	✓	✓
 <p>FIRE EXTINGUISHER Every vessel with an inboard engine or carrying hydrocarbon consuming appliances, must carry an approved type fire extinguisher.</p>	✓	✓	✓	✓
 <p>ANCHOR AND LINE An efficient anchor and line must be carried.</p>	—	✓	✓	✓
 <p>LIFEJACKET A lifejacket bearing the Australian standard AS 1512 or PFD Type 1 must be carried for every person on board the vessel.</p>	—	✓	✓	✓
 <p>RED AND ORANGE FLARES A minimum of two hand-held red flares and two hand-held orange smoke flares must be carried. Two parachute flares may be carried in lieu of two red hand-held flares. An orange smoke canister may be carried in lieu of the smoke flares.</p>	—	✓	✓	✓
 <p>EPIRB An EPIRB bearing the standard MS 241, AS/NZS 4330 or AS/NZS 4280 must be carried if proceeding more than 2 miles from the mainland shore or more than 400 metres from an island located more than 2 miles from the mainland shore.</p>	—	—	✓	✓
 <p>PARACHUTE FLARES A minimum of two parachute flares must be carried if operating more than 5 miles from the mainland shore or more than 1 mile from an island located more than 5 miles from the mainland shore.</p>	—	—	—	✓
 <p>MARINE RADIO A marine radio must be carried if operating more than 5 miles from the mainland shore or more than 1 mile from an island located more than 5 miles from the mainland shore. The radio can be 27 MHz, VHF or HF.</p>	—	—	—	✓
